Bishop Gilbert Filter, Pastor Nils Rohwer (retired Lutheran bishop from the Western Cape) and Pastor Helga Warnke (George congregation) have also indicated their willingness to assist with services in our congregation.

We also have very capable lay preachers in our midst and thank them in advance for their ministry in our congregation.

We hope to be able to finalise the calling of a new pastor by mid 2015.

From the Pastor's Heart

Dear Friends!

For the new year the watchword is a brief word from Romans 15:7:

“Welcome/receive one another, therefore, just as Christ as
welcomed/received you, for the glory of God.”

This being the last article I will write officially as the pastor of this congregation, I think it is a very fitting word from St Paul on which to base my message. The 14 years that my family and I have had the privilege of being in your congregation have been years in which we have experienced a hearty welcome, being fully received and accepted. Through this, and I have heard it from many people that a feeling of being welcome is at the heart of this congregation. The centre of the Gospel of Jesus Christ was made the basis of your life together as members of this congregation. And let's be quite clear about this – welcoming others, often strange and different from ourselves, is not always an easy thing to do. We are so often wary and worried that strangers will disrupt and disturb the peace in our community. And yet this “welcoming of the stranger” in your midst is a very important way of living the Gospel in a practical and down to earth way – and everyone can take part in it – we don't need much training or fancy thinking to get it right – we only need an awareness of the one thing that is of utmost importance: That Christ has welcomed/received us! We all are God's children on account of Christ dying for us on the cross and being raised to new life by God to endorse Christ's message of Grace and Forgiveness for all sinners.

And so with Paul I want to exhort and encourage you to continue being the welcoming, receiving, accepting community that you have shown us to be. Looking into the future (I can't of course really do that), I see that more and more our congregation will be a congregation of Christians from many different backgrounds – and all the more it will be good for us all to keep this word of St Paul in mind. In the time that lies ahead various different pastors will be coming to serve the congregation and in time the new pastor called into this service here will be installed and they all will also need to find the welcoming, accepting, receiving hearts that you have shown me.

I want to thank you all for 14 wonderful years of working and living together here in Port Elizabeth – living as God's beloved children and working to bring God's message of Grace and Forgiveness to the community, the city and the many people we came into contact with over the years. You faithfully supported me and my family and words cannot express how deeply grateful we are for your support. May God continue to guide and bless you all, both at home and as you work together in the congregation to welcome/receive the strangers in your midst as Christ welcomed/received you to the Glory of God.

Was der Pastor auf dem Herzen hat

Liebe Gemeinde und Freunde,
für das neue Jahr (2015) ist die Jahreslosung ein Wort aus dem Römerbrief des Apostels Paulus (15,7):

„Nehmt einander an, wie Christus euch angenommen hat zu Gottes Lob.“

Das ist nun wohl der letzte Artikel, den ich offiziell als Pastor dieser Gemeinde für den Gemeindebrief schreibe – und da ist es doch sicherlich sehr passend, dieses Wort des Apostels als Grundlage meines Schreibens zu nehmen. 14 Jahr waren wir (die Meylahns) hier in Eurer Gemeinde und wir haben uns von Anfang an wohl gefühlt, aufgenommen in euren Herzen, angenommen, wie Christus uns annimmt. Ich habe es immer wieder von Menschen gehört, die in diese Gemeinde als Gäste oder als Dazu gezogene kamen, dass sie in dieser Gemeinde ganz besonders stark das Gefühl hatten, angenommen, akzeptiert, willkommen zu sein. Da ist also das Zentrum des Evangeliums zur Grundlage des Lebens in dieser Gemeinde geworden. Dabei muss uns ganz klar sein, dass es gar nicht so einfach ist, einen anderen, fremden Menschen anzunehmen. Wir sind eigentlich doch etwas zurückhaltend und vielleicht sogar ängstlich, weil andere, fremde Menschen ja auch Unruhe und Veränderung in die Gemeinde bringen können. Aber gerade darum ist es ja so ein wichtiges Zeichen der christlichen Botschaft, wenn wir andere Menschen annehmen, ihnen zeigen, dass wir in Christus mit ihnen verbunden sind. Und das geschieht in solch einer praktischen, einfachen Art, dass alle sich daran beteiligen können – ohne besondere Ausbildung oder hochfliegende Gedanken – nur eines brauchen wir dazu: das klare Bewusstsein, dass Christus uns angenommen hat und dass wir darum mit allen anderen Christen zusammen gehören. Er ist für uns und für alle Menschen gestorben und am dritten Tag von Gott aus dem Tod auferweckt worden – damit wollte Gott sagen: Seine Botschaft der Gnade und Vergebung für die Sünder ist wahr – sie gilt für jeden, der sie hört.

Darum möchte ich nun mit Paulus Sie/euch noch einmal dazu ermuntern, diesen Zuspruch zu hören und daraus zu leben – auch in die Zukunft dieser Gemeinde hineinzugehen mit diesem Bewusstsein: wir sind alle zusammen Gottes Kinder. Ich sehe, wie immer mehr Menschen ganz unterschiedlicher Herkunft sich unserer Gemeinde anschließen – sie fühlen sich hier wohl – und das ist gut so – ja, ich wünsche es der Gemeinde, dass dieses ganz bewusst als Aufgabe gesehen wird, Menschen diese Annahme Gottes spürbar zu schenken.

Auch wenn im nächsten Jahr nun verschiedene Pfarrer sich um diese Gemeinde kümmern und dann auch bald die Pfarrstelle fest besetzt wird – sie alle werden es sehr gut brauchen können, dass sie spüren, hier sind sie angenommen, hier wird ihnen die Liebe und Freundlichkeit Gottes entgegen gebracht. Das haben wir Meylahns nun die letzten 14 Jahre hier bei euch/Ihnen erlebt – und dafür wollen wir ein ganz großes Dankeschön sagen. Zusammen konnten wir hier leben als Kinder Gottes und Arbeiter in Gottes Weinberg – damit die Liebe, Gnade und Vergebung, die Christus für uns am Kreuz erkämpft hat, die Menschen in dieser Stadt erreichen. MEMBER CONTRIBUTIONS

Dear Members

This congregation has always worked on a system of a “contribution” from members to meet the Levy that must be paid to the Cape Church who cover the costs of employing Pastors. This contribution is paid monthly by most members by means of a debit order into the Church bank account. Others make an annual payment or add their contribution into the collections made during services.

The serious shortfall in contributions estimated at the end of this year (R30,000.00) has prompted the need to ask everyone to look into their finances and seriously consider increasing their contribution. As a guideline, if the subsidised Cape Church Levy* is divided by the number of baptised members, each would be required to contribute R187.00 per month or rounded off to R500.00 per average family.

The Church is very appreciative of those who contribute more and understands that there are those who can only pay less.

We have not in the recent past practiced a “statement” system recording contributions but have come to realise that some people rely on reminders. All transactions are treated with complete confidentiality.
