CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - 2013

The year 2013 will go down in our history as the record, fundraising year. A 21% increase in the Christmas Market income excluding the R18,000.00 income from Running Shoe sales and there are still 7 pairs left. Expenses were kept in control exceeding budget by only 1.6% and 5% up on the previous year. Before stealing all of the treasurer's thunder I want to run the risk of thanking one person above all and that is Dieter Horni of Continental Tyres for the exceptional donation of 50 pairs of top quality, Adidas running shoes for the Christmas Market.

Building maintenance costs were kept low as there were no major items tackled. So large price projects e.g. hall floor covering (R40,000.00), painting of the church center inside (R30,000.00) and outside (R20,000.00) of the buildings **remain on our wish list.**

Instead of thanking each individual committee member as I have in the past I want to single out Gerry West for once again rising to the challenge under exceptionally difficult circumstances. He was coerced into running the Christmas Market again after the previous year that would have scared off any lesser man. A very big thank you Gerry for two record Christmas Markets, an act that is going to be very hard to follow but that will be for someone else as he is retiring, at the top. No comeback this year and we respect that. **Who is out there looking for a challenge?**

Of course by now we all know that another vacancy will be created at the end of this year when Pastor Felix and the entire, talented Meylahn clan head for Stellenbosch. What an era this has been for our congregation (14??? years). Not only a Frau Pastor to back him up but a Quintet of Minstrels that we will truly miss. This will be Pastor Felix's last AGM in this congregation. The extended church committee has started the process of calling a new minister to Friedenskirche.

Finally I need to warn that we will again be facing a serious financial challenge for 2014 and caution against complacency. The financial report will show a budgeted deficit **of R33,826.40** with the levy subsidy of R120,000.00 already accorded by the Cape Church.

Was dem Pastor am Herzen liegt

Jahresbericht des Pastors für das Jahr 2013
Vorgelegt bei der Gemeindeversammlung in der Friedenskirche,
Port Elizabeth am 26. Januar 2014

Im Jahr 2013 ist mir, mehr als je zuvor, klar geworden, dass wir zwar unsere Pläne und Hoffnungen haben, aber dass diese nicht für Gott als Vorlage dienen, nach der er dann unser Leben für uns einrichtet. Viele von Ihnen haben diese Einsicht schon längst bekommen und ich bewundere es, mit wieviel Mut und Glaubenskraft Sie trotzdem ihren Lebensweg gehen. Es ist meine Hoffnung, dass ich, durch meine Arbeit in dieser Gemeinde Ihnen, wenigstens hier und da helfen konnte, dieses Leben weiterhin mutig und getrost anzupacken. In einem Land, dessen Regierung sich scheinbar nicht sonderlich um die Bedürfnisse der Bevölkerung bemüht, ist so ein tief verwurzeltetes Gottvertrauen wohl eine der wichtigsten Gaben, die eine christliche Gemeinde weitergeben kann. In den Gottesdiensten und Bibelkreisen war dieses jedenfalls stets mein Bemühen – ob es mir gelungen ist, überlasse ich dem Urteil anderer.

Ein Pastorenbericht hat ja auch die viel demütigere Aufgabe, das vergangene Jahr dankbar zu bedenken und zu berichten, was getan wurde:

Wir haben den Gottesdienst Rhythmus, der sich nun schon über viele Jahre hin bewährt hat, beibehalten und so können wir berichten, dass der Gottesdienstbesuch langsam aber sicher gewachsen ist, und ich kann von mir aus sagen, dass diese Gottesdienste im Herzen und Zentrum meiner ganzen Arbeit stehen. Ich feiere sehr gerne Gottesdienst und mache die dankbare Erfahrung, dass auch viele andere fröhlich mitfeiern – dabei ist „fröhlich“ vielleicht nicht das wichtigste Kriterium – es geht um eine tiefere Freude, die auch Tränen und Schmerzen und Traurigkeit in der Kraft des Evangeliums mit-tragen kann.

Viele von Ihnen wissen, dass ich auch für den Gemeindeverband Bloemfontein/Kimberley zuständig bin, und darum bin ich des Öfteren nicht hier in Port Elizabeth (mindestens ein mal im Monat). Ich möchte hier ein besonderes Dankeswort denen aussprechen, die dafür sorgen, dass in meiner Abwesenheit die Gottesdienste usw. weiterlaufen – ganz besonders danke ich Henry Newman, der mit großem Einsatz und Elan diese Aufgaben wahrnimmt.

Ein weiteres Wort des Dankes an unsere Musiker – die immer fröhlich dafür sorgen, dass unsere Gottesdienste mit Musik und Gesang fröhlich gefeiert werden können. Ingrid Haschick, Jutta Rohwer und Brian Arends, unseren Organisten sage ich einen besonderen Dank für ihren Dienst.

Unsere Kindergottesdienste sind wieder im Aufblühen, wenn auch sehr „leise“ – mit großer Mühe sind die Mitarbeiter dabei, diese schwierige Aufgabe wahrzunehmen. Es sind ja doch immer noch sehr kleine Gruppen, und manchmal sind die Altersunterschiede sehr groß, da ist ein gemeinsamer Kindergottesdienst ganz schön kompliziert. Dennoch denke ich, dass die Kinder das sehr zu schätzen wissen.

Was dem Pastor am Herzen liegt

Im letzten Jahr haben wir auch mit einer neuen Konfirmandengruppe angefangen und diese jungen Leute sind nun festen Schrittes auf dem Weg, selbstständige Christen zu werden, die über ihren Glauben Rechenschaft geben können, wenn sie gefragt werden. Ich habe mir vorgenommen, diese Gruppe noch zu konfirmieren, bevor ich dann fortgehe – und darum muss ich ein besonderes Wort an die Konfirmanden richten: Es kommt doch sehr auf euer „commitment“ an – dadurch kommt ihr zwar nicht in den Himmel – das habt ihr hoffentlich schon begriffen, aber für den Werdegang eines Mitglieds der Gemeinde Jesu Christi ist es entscheidend, dass man sich auf dieses Abenteuer Glauben auch wirklich einlässt – und dazu gehört auch der regelmäßige Gottesdienstbesuch und selbstverständlich auch die Bereitschaft, fleißig den Inhalt des Glaubens zu studieren.

Unsere Hauskreise (eine deutsche Gruppe und eine englische) haben sich regelmäßig allwöchentlich getroffen (manchmal zusammen, wenn wir etwas weniger waren). Sehr gerne möchte ich andere dazu ermuntern, bei diesen Treffen mitzumachen – es ist ein wichtiger Aspekt des christlichen Lebens, sich in einer Gemeinschaft gegenseitig wahr zu nehmen, aufeinander zu hören, füreinander zu beten und einander ein Stück des Weges zu begleiten. Dabei lernen wir dann auch unseren Glauben neu verstehen. Wir sind zurzeit dabei, den Kleinen Katechismus Martin Luthers durch zu arbeiten und ich hoffe doch sehr, dass dabei den Teilnehmern die Augen aufgehen für den großen Reichtum unserer Glaubenstradition.

Der Kirchenvorstand hat weiterhin die Gemeinde und ihre Gebäude und Geschäfte verantwortlich geführt und ich bin sehr dankbar, dass ich mit so einem treuen und kompetenten „Team“ zusammenarbeiten darf. Ich hoffe, dass wir in diesem Jahr auch einige jüngere Leute dazu animieren können, sich an dieser Verantwortung zu beteiligen.

2014 wird mein letztes Jahr in dieser Gemeinde sein, da die Stellenbosch Gemeinde mich für 2015 als Pastor dorthin berufen hat. Es ist zwar jetzt noch nicht Zeit, Abschied zu nehmen, aber ich möchte dazu doch auch in diesem Bericht etwas sagen. Es waren sehr gesegnete und frohe Jahre, die ich hier bei Ihnen/Euch verbringen durfte. Noch selten habe ich von einer Gemeinde gehört, die so fest und kompetent dazu bereit ist, den Kern, der eine Gemeinde ausmacht, zu vertreten: Die Verkündigung des Evangeliums! Dennoch denke ich, dass ich eine neue Herausforderung brauche – und die werde ich sicherlich in Stellenbosch finden – und auch dass diese Gemeinde eine neue Herausforderung braucht – einen Pastor/eine Pastorin, der/die andere Gaben und Talente hat als ich. Dabei müssen Sie/müsst Ihr darauf achten, dass der Kern stehen bleibt – die klare und getreue Verkündigung des reinen Evangeliums. Wer immer dann euer Pastor/eure Pastorin wird, darf sich glücklich schätzen, in diese Gemeinde berufen worden zu sein, denn Ihr seid eine treue Gemeinde der Heiligen Gottes.

Zum Schluss sage ich nochmal Danke für den Segen der mir und meiner Familie in dieser Gemeinde zuteil wurde und ich bete, dass Gott uns alle weiterhin segnet und begleitet, uns im Glauben bewahrt, in der Hoffnung und in der Liebe, damit wir zusammen die Arbeit, zu der wir berufen sind, ausführen können: Allen Menschen das Evangelium zu verkünden.

From the Pastor's Heart

Pastoral Report for the year 2013

Delivered to the AGM of the Lutheran Church – Friedenskirche, Port Elizabeth
On the 26th January 2014

"I believe that nothing meaningless has happened to me and also that it is good for us when things run counter to our desires. I see a purpose in my present existence and only hope that I fulfil it." Quoted in Renate Bethge, Dietrich Bonhoeffer: A Brief Life (Fortress Press, Minneapolis)

The year 2013 has been one in which the above quote from Dietrich Bonhoeffer has come to mean something more to me than it has ever done before. It is a reminder to me now, that our own plans and hopes are not blueprints for God and the future God has in mind for us. I do think that many of you have had this insight driven home to you way before I got around to understanding it and I honour you for the resilience and courage with which you have faced the ups and downs of your lives. My only hope is that through my ministry, especially through my sermons, I have been able here and there to help you stand firm in that resilience and courage. In a country that is socially and politically unstable and seemingly ruled by people who have not much more than their own interests at heart, a solid grounding in our faith, in the trust that God is graciously guiding history, including our little stories, is probably one of the most important gifts a congregation can offer its members. In our divine services and house church group meetings this has been my focus – but whether I have been able to get that across, whether I have been fulfilling the purpose of my existence, is not up to me to determine.

A pastoral report has the far more humble task of gratefully looking back over the past year to give account of what has been done:

We have kept to our divine services rhythm, which seems to have become so well established and accepted that it has become second nature. The attendance at these services has risen overall and I, for my part, can say that they are at the centre and heart of what I do in this congregation. And I celebrate them gladly – with the added experience of seeing many members also really “enjoying” them – although, of course, “enjoying” is not really a primary criterion for a good service – joy is – but that may also include tears, pain and sadness, which the Gospel helps us to face honestly and courageously.

As many of you know, I have been placed in charge of the Bloemfontein/Kimberley Parish, and this has caused me to be absent from PE quite regularly at least once a month. I say a special word of thanks to all those who have and are still helping with the services here in the Friedenskirche on those weekends, when I am away. I must especially mention Henry Newman, who has been a tremendous help.

From the Pastor's Heart

A big thanks also to our musicians who have been making sure that our services are celebrated with joyful songs and sounds. To Ingrid Haschick, Jutta Rohwer and Brian Arends, our organists, a special thanks for all your hard work.

Our children's services have slowly but surely returned during the last year and I heartily commend the efforts of all those involved in this very difficult task. Small numbers and large age differences are not easy to handle – well done and keep going, I'm sure the children do appreciate it.

Last year we started with a new group of confirmands who are now well under way to becoming "adult Christians" – people who can give account of their faith, when called upon to do so. We have planned to complete the course this year and hopefully, all participants will be confirmed by the end of the year. I do want to encourage the congregation to pray for these young people and to ask yourselves how you could support them in practical ways. And to the confirmands I want to emphasise that a lot does depend on their commitment – no, that will not get you saved, nothing that you do will – but for the organisational process of being confirmed as an adult member of the congregation, you do have to show serious and ongoing commitment, in other words, attend classes regularly and come to divine services, that's the only way you'll learn what it means to be an adult Christian, responsible and well informed about our faith!

Our house church groups (German and English) have been meeting regularly – very often, in the past year, we had combined meetings, because we were only a few participants. I would like to encourage more people to join us for these meetings – it is an essential part of Christian life to participate in the lives of others who are on the same journey – pray with each other and study the faith together. Recently we started work on the Small Catechism of Martin Luther and I hope that it has re-opened the eyes and hearts in the group for the treasure we have in our tradition.

The church committee has continued with its work of keeping the congregation and its infrastructure functioning well. They are such a wonderful group of committed people that it is a real joy for me to be allowed to work with and alongside them. We do need a couple of new recruits and perhaps we can as a congregation make a special effort this year to identify some younger men and women, who would be willing to join this team and take this congregation into the future.

From the Pastor's Heart

2014 will be my last year in this congregation, as I have been called to become the pastor of the Stellenbosch congregation at the beginning of 2015. It is not time to say farewell yet, but I do want to include some thoughts about this in this report. It has been a most blessed and encouraging time for me (these past 13+ years). Seldom have I ever heard of or come across a congregation that is so competent and willing to focus on what really matters: the proclamation of the Gospel! I do however feel that I need a new challenge, which Stellenbosch will certainly be, and also that this congregation needs a new "challenge", a pastor with different gifts and talents, that can encourage you to grow in areas that I could not. You all know that I am not one of those who have jumped on the band wagon of "church growth", especially not in terms of numerical growth as an end in itself. If we cannot grow in faith and depth of courage for life in this broken world as individuals within a community, then numerical growth will mean nothing. I do hope that you will continue in this direction with the pastor that you will then call to serve up the Gospel to you in Word and Sacrament. He or she will be a very lucky person to be called to serve you here in Port Elizabeth.

I end with a grateful note of thanks for the blessings that I have received from you all and from God throughout the last year and with a prayer that God will continue to bless and preserve us with faith, hope and love, so that we can together carry on with the work that we've been called to do: Proclaim the Gospel of God's grace to everybody!

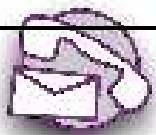
