Psalm 38 - A groan before the throne



The Psalm is believed to have been written late in David's Life and it was oft conjectured as a biography of sorts for David. It may have been David's intent to commit to music to transmit what he had learnt through his life, of the relationship he had with his Lord before he passed.

The Psalm's topic is God's displeasure at sin. (1–11) and the psalmist's sufferings and prayers (12–22). The Psalm opens with a prayer, David felt as if he had been forgotten by his God. It then passes intermittently between complaint and hope. Benjamin Weiss noted the "depth of misery into which the psalmist gradually plunges in his complaints, then the sudden grasp at the arm of mercy and omnipotence."

The psalmist pours his heart out before God. He admits to his sin,

his failures, his foolishness. It is clear that he is not innocent in the situation he finds himself in. But he doesn't remain stuck there. He brings his needs before God, all of it, the physical, social, and emotional. The wounds are deep, his heart is racing, he is exhausted, it looks dark all around.

He is disappointed, wounded, socially isolated. If physical strength and social integration are the requirements for a fulfilled life, then he would be feeling closer to death than to life. The little energy that is left inside of him he utilizes to turn to God. From God, and only from God, can there come rescue and salvation. The psalmist waits in anticipation and his hope is that God will turn His face toward him and lead him out of his misery.

When we follow the movement of this psalm, we will notice that the psalmist is finding himself on a rollercoaster ride. The movement goes up and down and up again, fluctuating between the painful experience of being in trouble and God's mercy and compassion right in the middle of this trouble.

As difficult as it may seem for us to accept and understand: God is in the middle of everything we perceive to be a mess and bad,

working for our good. That's what God does. We often try to make sense of the world and our own lives based on a very incomplete picture. It's like looking through the knothole of our pain. And then we tend to believe that God is not good, cannot be good, if He allows all the pain and evil in the world, including our own.

But, here's the thing: God is good. And if we knew God and how much He loves us, then even when we don't understand we could know that God is always at work in our lives, working for our good, and then we could trust God.

In Psalm 38 the psalmist experiences God as a God who disciplines, a God who is far away. And yet he turns to this very God, because he hopes that this God will, despite everything, listen to him and that God is the One who can intervene. And so, through all the highs and lows of this prayer, the psalmist persists in trusting God, despite the fact that his current experiences and circumstances show no reason to. He still finds enough reason to pray:

"Lord, you know all my desires and deepest longings. My tears are liquid words and you can read them all." Amen.

Partnership for Missional Churches (PMC) and Listening Process

The 6 Disruptive Missional Practices are to help us to create new habits in our being church. Dwelling in the Word, Dwelling in the World and Spiritual Discernment are part of being equipped to go out and make disciples.

The next habit to focus on is the Focus on Missional Action. Instead of getting busy to do everything, we need to ask: where are we heading? Who pointed us there? How is God moving and how can we catch God's gust in our sails? May this journey be a fruitful one.

Training for Preachers and Laity
Pastor Anja Spiske has been appointed by Church Council on a 25% post to lead the training of preachers and to equip the laity for ministry. Due to her illness the first course could not take place as planned on 18 August in East London nor on 15 September 2018 in Port Elizabeth. The course on 22 September 2018 at the Friedenskirche in Stellenbosch was led by Pastor Felix Meylahn.

Please note that this training is not only aimed at equipping the preachers, but all ministry leaders in core aspects of Lutheran doctrine and teaching.





Was Frau Pastorin am Herzen liegt

Psalm 38 “Es ist genug, wende dich mir wieder zu!”

Gleich zu Beginn betet der Mensch “Klartext”. Gott muss aufhören mit seinen Züchtigungen, er muss ablassen von seinem Zorn. Denn der Beter ist durch und durch getroffen von Gottes Grimm. Klar, unschuldig ist dieser Mensch nicht an seiner Situation. Seine Verfehlungen, seine Torheit, seine Sünde gesteht er ein. Lange bleibt er aber nicht stehen bei der Ursachenforschung, die aktuelle Lage ist zu bedrohlich. Er schüttet vor Gott sein Herz aus, schildert seine Not – die körperliche, soziale und seelische. In Mark und Bein ist er getroffen, seine Verletzung schreit zum Himmel, sein Herz rast, er ist kraftlos und matt, es sieht dunkel aus.

Damit noch nicht genug. Freunde haben ihn verlassen, Feinde hassen ihn. Schadenfreude überall. Er ist enttäuscht, verletzt, sozial isoliert. Wenn körperliche Kraft und soziale Integration eine Voraussetzung für ein erfülltes Leben sind, so ist der Mensch seinem Gefühl nach, dem Tod näher als dem Leben. Alle Energie, die ihm noch bleibt, nutzt er, um sich an Gott zu wenden. Von Gott, und nur von Gott kann die Rettung kommen. Der Beter erwartet, dass die Zuwendung von Gott die Abwendung der Not bringt. Geht man dem Fluss dieses Gebets nach, so fällt einem auf, dass sich

der Beter wie auf einer Achterbahn bewegt. Schmerzliches Empfinden in der Not, Gottes Erbarmen in dieser Not und dann das eigene Vertrauen zu Gott wechseln sich ab. Einerseits erfährt der Mensch Gott als einen der züchtigt, der fern ist. Und trotzdem wendet er sich genau diesem Gott zu, weil er darauf hofft, dass Gott trotz allem hört und eingreifen kann. So zieht sich durch alle Höhen und Tiefen dieses Gebets das Vertrauen des Menschen auf Gott, obwohl die aktuelle Erfahrung dazu keinen Grund gibt. Der Beter traut sich, Gott zu bestürmen und zum Schluss drängt er ihn zur Eile und nennt ihn “meine Rettung”, damit sich Gott tatsächlich als Retter erweist.

Gebet: Treuer Gott, ich danke Dir, dass ich Dich und mich immer wieder an Dein Versprechen Deiner Zuwendung erinnern darf, selbst in dunklen Zeiten. Schenke mir Vertrauen und gib mir ein festes Herz, das nicht davon ablässt, Dir zu vertrauen. Amen.

Neue Gewohnheiten für das Kirche-Sein-Verständnis entdecken mittels »6 Disruptive Missional Practises« : “Dwelling in the Word“ (“Ins Wort eintauchen”), “Dwelling in the World“ (“In der Welt verweilen”) und “Spiritual Discernment“ (“sich auf die spirituelle Sinnsuche ausrichten”). Nun geht es um die Ausrichtung zu “Missional Action“. Es geht nicht nur darum, dass wir uns mit vielen Aktivitäten befassen, sondern uns fragen: wohin sind wir unterwegs? Wer gibt uns die Anweisungen diesen Weg zu beschreiten?
